
## Minimally Invasive Surgery (MIS) OR Setup


## Left Foot, Right-Handed Surgeon



With this setup, a right-handed surgeon will reach across the leg to access the medial side of the operative leg.

The mini-c arm will be brought in from the side opposite the surgeon.

## Left Foot, Left-Handed Surgeon



Left-handed surgeons are positioned at the end of the bed between the back table and mini-c arm to easily access the medial side of the operative leg.

In both setups, the mirror image is used in the case of a right foot operation.
